

Guillaume de Laubier, a photographer who has regularly contributed to Elle Décor, Vogue, and Maison Française, is the author of several books, including Abramsâ TM The Most Beautiful Libraries in the World. Antoine Pecqueur is a journalist for Le Monde, the French television channel Mezzo, and the classical music periodical La Lettre du Musicien.

My first quibble is that I bought the book for \$60 and days later noticed it was now \$40. A hint, , people don't like that. As far as the book goes, it is beautifully produced and photographed and very nostalgic if you have been to a house in question, exciting if you haven't (yet). Never having realised my life ambition of visiting Bayreuth and Salzburg, those were keenly interesting. There were some odd omissions, the Colon in Buenos Aires, Mexico City, the San Carlos in Lisbon etc. Others were given very short shrift even though gorgeous and famous. There are some arty angles and views which are pretty but then one sacrifices any real view of what it looks like. My main complaint, and the reason for 3 stars instead of 4, is the endless procession of modern, boring opera houses which most resemble parking garages. I remember being in Oslo a few years ago and passing the opera house. One of my companions said' "well you'll never see THAT in a coffee table book!" We all laughed, but here it is and more than one photo. Still, if you love opera and, like me, have some dream houses you will probably now never visit, get this book.
