

I was looking for more specific information on growing fruit trees and didn't find it here. It was a very good book and I wish I would have bought it first but I will keep it for my collection. Nice easy read and packed full of everything a novice gardener needs to know. You can't go wrong with this book.

This book is full of info, but it was not really the info I was looking for. Since I already have my trees purchased I was wanting more on planting, spraying and fertilizing. It has this info, but not as in depth as I wanted.

So far,it has answered all my questions about all my fruit trees...and I planted 2 dozen this year! I have sweet and sour cherry, 6 different varieties of apples, 4 different varieties of peaches, a nectarine, & 3 different plums. I now know why some of my cherries died, and how to save the rest. Being new to growing an orchard, this book has become invaluable. It is well worth the price.

I am a novice gardener and have planted 10 various fruit tree and I know enough that they all require different attention. This book is great (you can find the same information on the internet but that is far less convenient Han having the book). I find myself referring to information in this book frequently as I attempt to establish a mini fruit tree orchard.

Planning is everything and as I am getting ready to start the retirement cottage, this book is wonderful for tips on where to put the apple trees, what facing slope, standard, dwarf, semi dwarf? things I never thought about. It is interesting and has many useful information on a large variety of fruit trees and berries and I enjoyed reading it from the beginning till the end. I found it very comprising for strawberries, but a little less so for other berries (I was particularly interested in currants and raspberries). Overall it is a nice purchase and I am very happy about it. I keep turning to it every now and then to check how to tend to my fruit garden (about 40 fruit trees, a large patch of strawberries, 2 red currants trees, 2 types of raspberries and some black currant bushes and expanding).

This is a fantastic book!! I'm starting an orchard and already know quite a bit about fruit plants, but

this taught me a lot. Would be great for beginners and somewhat experienced gardeners alike. It covers a variety of trees, bushes, and other fruiting plants, even some more obscure fruits like currants and gooseberries. It covers site selections, planting, care, fertilizing, pruning, and harvesting. Many pictures and illustrations. I especially liked that it has charts showing different cultivars, which was helpful when I ordered new plants.
