

It is more of a manual and a blueprint than a typical book. It focuses on action, walkthroughs and tips. You really get a clear picture of how complicated it can be but at the same time you get tools that help you handle that complexity. All essential steps you need to take are chunked into manageable pieces. Very easy to navigate to where you are at in the development process and look for tips if you are stuck.
