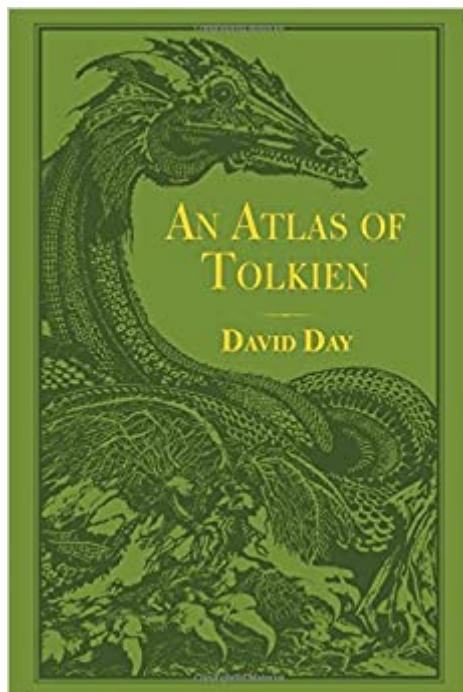

David Day is the author of five major books on the world of J.R.R. Tolkien, including Guide to Tolkien's World: A Bestiary and A Guide to Tolkien. Together with Tolkien: The Illustrated Encyclopedia, these books have been translated into sixteen languages, and have sold in excess of two million copies. A Canadian living in Toronto, Day has also published over 30 other books of mythology, history, fantasy, fiction, and poetry, for both adults and children.

It's a brief history of Tolkien's world. Starts at the beginning (Silmarillion) and ends with the Lord of the Rings. It brings together all the stories relating to middle-earth.

The book is a nice addition to any collector's library. Nice binding, and art familiar for those that the Tolkien picture encyclopedias from the 70s. Content is a cliff notes version of key people, places,

and events.
