

This particular neighborhood of Atlanta Georgia is experiencing a rapid transformation with exciting new projects such as the beltline for walkers and bikers that goes completely around Atlanta and passes the revitalization of the old Sear's building into shops, a restaurant court and apartments. The book provides a fascinating well documented history of this area of the city of Atlanta that rises again like the Phoenix bird that is its symbol. It makes a good read even for those not familiar with the city itself.
