

Fifty years after the Sexual Offences Act of 1967 decriminalised homosexual acts, Jonathan Dollimore explores, in, through and beyond the gay sub-cultures of cities like New York, Brighton and Sydney, what the new freedoms meant for him and others in the following decades. This is a remarkable memoir - poignant, funny and unflinching. The author records episodes from his life with a mixture of tenderness and acerbic wit that is a perfectly judged counterpoint to his reflections on their tangled threads of desire and loss. What's at the heart of this generous book is
