

What an awesome book! A doctor who worked as a missionary in Asia goes chapter by chapter explaining about the functioning of the human body and comparing it with the functioning of the body of Christ. My favorite chapter was looking at blood. Just as blood cleanses the human body by capturing waste products and then brings them to the lungs or other organs where they are expelled, so the "blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all unrighteousness". If you remember John 6:61 Jesus tells his disciples that his followers must drink his blood and eat his body, which resulted in many followers leaving. Tying this in with the fact that the "life is in the blood", the author explains how terrible this must have sounded to a kosher Jew, but how it is a perfect picture of believers being united with Christ and identified with him through communion. I highly recommend this book to give you a more complete understanding of what it means for believers to be part of the body of Christ.

My family and I enjoyed reading this together. It really was informative and spiritually thought-provoking, a science and Bible lesson all in one. The kids clamored for more. They are 12 and 15 years old.

Dr. Brand was excellent at portraying this sense of wonder by making use of vivid and descriptive stories. Particularly in chapter four, when he was describing a young woman whose life was saved by the blood that had so often sickened him. As an artist I found his descriptive writing intriguing, but overall the book failed to keep me engaged as a whole. It is detailed book written by someone with a vast amount of experience in life and the medical field. The actual experiences of Dr. Brand were fascinating, but unless your interest lies in the medical field this is probably not a book that would be found on the average reader's top ten list. However, this strength also has it's own problems in the fact that each idea seemed to drag on to the point where it seemed excessive and unneeded. It wasn't a particularly long book so it felt as though he attempted to cram as much information as he could in each point. This, I believe, is where I got this feeling of each notion dragging on to an excessive degree. I also was not partial to this particular writing style but that is merely personal preference. However, after all this is said and done, I do appreciate the author in several regards. First, his willingness to discuss this topic. Second, his unapologetic nature regarding scripture. Lastly, this inclusion of scripture to the degree he presented. This particular title was not a chore to read nor was a "bad" book, it just didn't live up to my expectations. I have had several friends who also read this title and enjoy it thoroughly and you might do the same! So take a look!

This book is one you can read time and time again -- and be re-inspired! If you are a Christian, his analogies of the body of Christ and the physical body give you a respect for both -- and an
