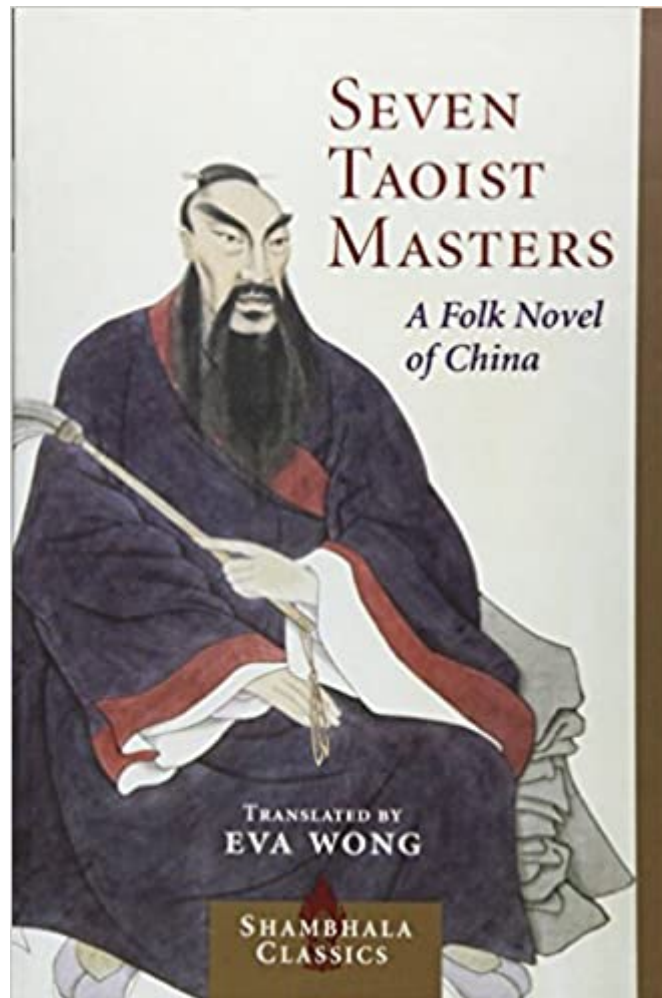

Synopsis

History and legend are interwoven in this folk novel that both entertains and instructs. Written by an unknown author, *Seven Taoist Masters* is the story of six men and one woman who overcome tremendous hardships on the journey to self-mastery. These characters and their teacher, Wang Ch'ung-yang, are all historical figures who lived in the Southern Sung (1127-1279) and Yuan (1271-1368) dynasties. Wang is regarded as the greatest patriarch of the Complete Reality school, a highly purified branch of Taoism having a strong affinity with Zen Buddhism. The novel brings to life the essentials of Taoist philosophy and practice, both through the instructions offered by Wang on topics such as the cultivation of mind and body, meditation techniques, and overcoming the obstacles to enlightenment and through the experiences of the characters.

Eva Wong is an independent scholar and a practitioner of the Taoist arts of the Pre-Celestial Way and Complete Reality lineages. She has written and translated many books on Taoism and related topics, including *A Master Course in Feng-Shui*; *Tales of the Taoist Immortals*; and *Taoism: An Essential Guide*.

This is an interesting and easy to read Taoist novel. There is a list of other books by her to read as well. Also I found out that she has a mediation retreat in Colorado where you can stay and sign up for classes. Fees are extremely modest and include meals.

I bought this book to use as inspiration and support in practicing my basic Taoist meditations. I read this book so fast I had to slow myself down so that I got more out of it and make it last longer! *Seven Taoist Masters* is the story of a Taoist practitioner's accomplishment of enlightenment/immortality and his leading seven disciples to this state. This book is great because it has teachings told in the form of a story making it very easy to incorporate personally. There are also direct teachings of masters given to disciples and many principles of the Tao are casually in the book allowing the reader to absorb the principles with little conscious effort. Fantastic book! One of my favorite parts of the book was seeing Buddhism and Taoism existing together in Chinese society and the interaction of various Taoist and Buddhist masters.
