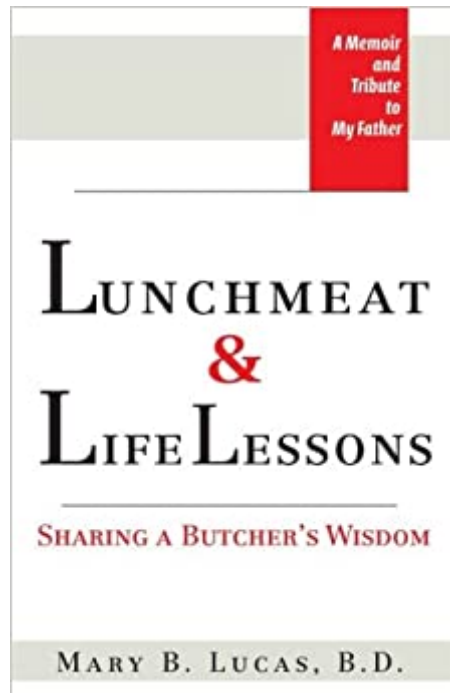




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# Lunchmeat & Life Lessons: Sharing A Butcher's Wisdom

John Bichelmeyer--the author's father--is introduced as a lifelong butcher lacking in formal education, but rich in wisdom. While Ms. Lucas places her father's advice in the context of business, anything in this book can be applied to your personal character outside the workplace. She conveniently summarizes the main quotes in large boxes throughout the book. Readers will be able to find some useful life lessons, courtesy of Mr. Bichelmeyer, that will improve themselves and their happiness. One piece of advice I especially enjoyed was, "Good luck? Bad luck? Who knows?" In other words, what may seem to be rotten luck may actually turn out to be a good thing in the end. Another one I was inspired by was, "Learn something from every person you meet." My take on this is that there are seven billion people out there, each with something different to teach you. Perhaps this is something to keep in mind the next time you interact with people from various backgrounds. If you're looking for a spark of inspiration, some wisdom to improve your personal or professional life, or maybe just a little advice to improve your happiness, you can't go wrong with "Lunchmeat and Life Lessons."
