

Written in 1944, this book is a classic must-have for those growing fruit tree and bushes. It is not a very big book, but instructions and illustrations are clear and easy to follow. The following plants, vines and bushes are covered in this book: almond, apple, apricot, avocado, berries (blackberry,

boysenberry, dewberry, gooseberry, loganberry, raspberry, victorberry and youngberry) cherry, currant, espallier, feijoa, figs, grapefruit, grapes, guava, lemon. lime, loquat, nectarine, olive, orange, peaches, pear, pecan, persimmon, pineapple guava, plums, pomegranate, pomelo. quince, and walnut. The book also covers how to train young trees, how to plant trees, summer pruning and root pruning. As you can see, this book covers a lot of information. I highly recommend as a resource.

Fails to provide descriptions of basic terminology. The book has pretty low goals to begin with, but then fails to meet those goals by leaving out key explanations.
