I'd recommend this honest history of Amsterdam to anyone planning a visit. Very well done and informative. Much of history one wouldn't normally hear from travel agencies.

I was assigned this book as a pre-departure read for a college study abroad program and have been thrilled by Mak's descriptions, research, and integration of primary sources to reveal an evolution of Amsterdam's culture from its very beginnings to the complex identity of the city today. It is not too heavy and is broken up into easy to read sections, so you can easily start and finish stories while in a waiting room. I highly recommend this book to anyone looking to learn more about Amsterdam before visiting.

I chose this book over the more recent book by Russell Shorto based on a review of the latter in the NYTimes. I found it to be an honest, balanced account of the city's history that is often idealized. For me, it was an excellent preparation for my first visit to the city.

This book reminds me of an outstanding history teacher who maintains the interest of his students with a series of fascinating and relevant anecdotes. I enjoyed reading it and I feel that I now have a much better appreciation of this city. I highly recommend it to anyone planning a visit to Amsterdam.
