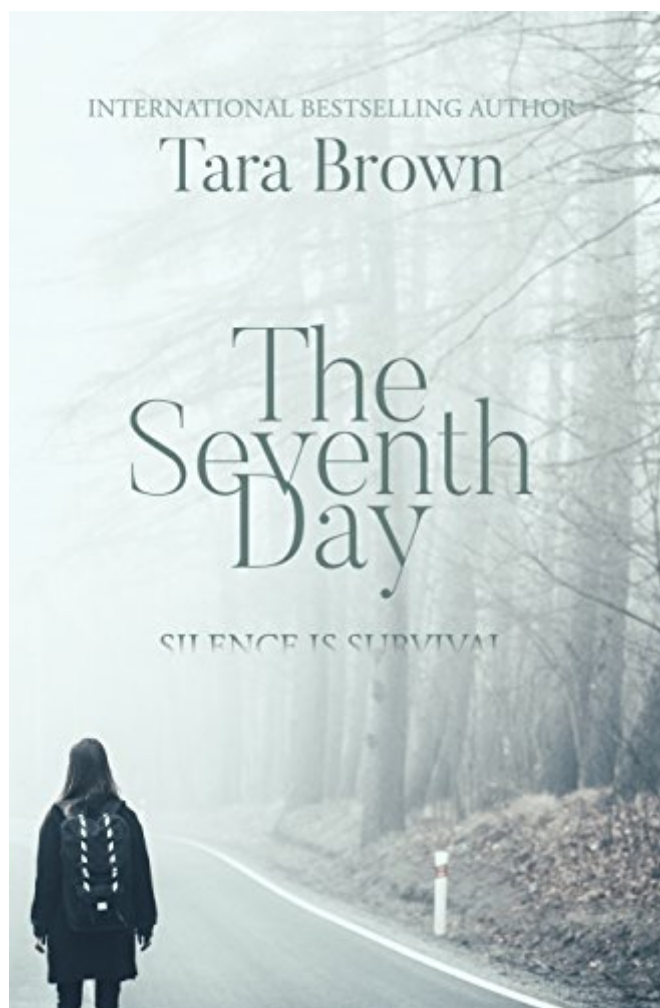

her weakness, how easily she will admit her fears and her mistakes. This story feels so real and raw. There are some great dystopian/post apoc books that are great, but so unrealistic and hard to relate to. But these characters are relatable, they are scared, they search for coffee!, they pee their pants, they fail and they break down and cry. I loved all the characters instantly, they were all so well written and fun. There are some real emotional parts in here too. Hard parts that make you wonder what you would do, how you would react, could you do certain things? It's a book you can feel connected too. And the story line is just believable enough to be creepy and a little scary. The ending is great, wraps up nicely, but leaves you with something great and some more scary to look forward to. Born is my fav series of all time, and I loved Imaginations too, and The Seventh Day is another amazing book in the dystopian/post apoc genre by Tara Brown writing as AE Watson!

I could easily relate to Lou-I would kick ass during the ZA but I'm sure I'd pee in my pants a time or two! There will be a book 2 but so happy the ending didn't feel like a huge cliffhanger! I can somewhat patiently wait for book 2 :)

Cleverly written story, a little bit sweet for me but I still enjoyed it. The characters were believable and quite strong in their convictions. As to the biters and the story behind them, well ! That's was very clever. Lou, the young lady who is the main character is just a sweet, determined and lucky lady, she had to make decisions for her little sister and her friends, she managed to rescue them

and keep them safe. The whole story is about her finding her father who was trying to make it home before the world fell. The ending leaves you wanting more, as with all apolitical stories the bad guys need sorting out too. And in book two I think that's where we are going.

I loved Tara Brown's Born series & was looking forward to reading more from her & in my book she has done it again writing a fantastic opener to a new series. I had been impatiently waiting the release of The Seventh Day since reading the first excerpt for it. When I finally got to read it I was not disappointed! It's a story of survival, family, sacrifice & love. Following Lou & her friends through their journey I wasn't quite sure what to expect, it follows some of the normal Zombie book themes but then takes a new spin as well which was refreshing. I now eagerly await book two & hope that more people keep discovering this fantastic author.

This story was ok. Very typical zombie apocalypse plot like many other books but slightly different although not really a big twist whatsoever. If you're looking for a mediocre storyline with vague details of a zombie survivor's journey, then this is for you. I almost couldn't finish the book because as I got towards the end I realized that there wasn't really any significant resolution apart from the survivors just dealing how to survive. This book is very predictable so I will not continue reading the second book.
