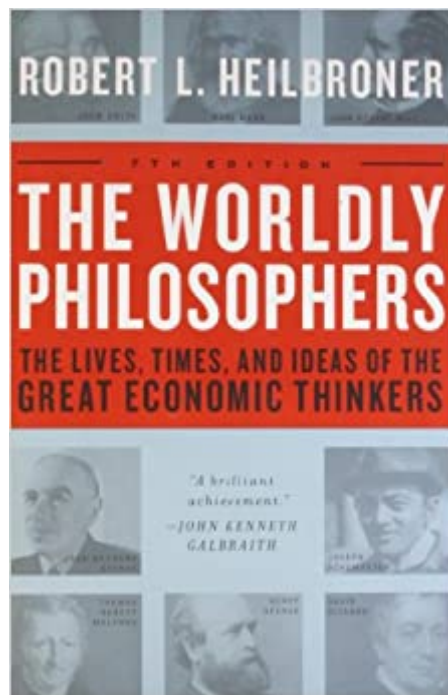

This book will take you on a whirlwind tour of a selected subset of economic thinkers from the past centuries through today. If you don’t already have an in depth knowledge of economics history, prepare to change how you view money and growth. Even if you are experienced in economic history, the final chapter presents a moving goal for economics within the coming decades.

Definitely enjoyed finishing this book (would have said reading it but it was a difficult read at times). I had to re-read chapters twice sometimes just to make sure I got the point. But after reading this book, I have a good foundational understanding on how the "free market" came to be here in the US. This book was recommended by Robert Kiyosaki (Rich Dad, Poor Dad) which is why I bought it in the first place.

I initially bought this book for a first-year economics class I was taking in college back in the early 1980s; I wanted to see how the author had updated it. He explains in as simple language as possible the lives and ideas of the great economists; he gives an uncomplicated explanation of supply and demand without going into tedious detail or any graphs. It's economics for a liberal-arts person without the mathematics. I highly recommend it to anyone interested in or thinking about investing for personal or professional reasons.

This should be required reading at every high school in the country. I didn't get to read it the first time until I was in college and I wish I had been introduced to basic economics at an earlier stage in my education. Our country would be a better place to live if our leaders had at least some understanding of human nature and how it drives the economic engine. Perhaps then they would be less inclined to interfere with the natural order.
