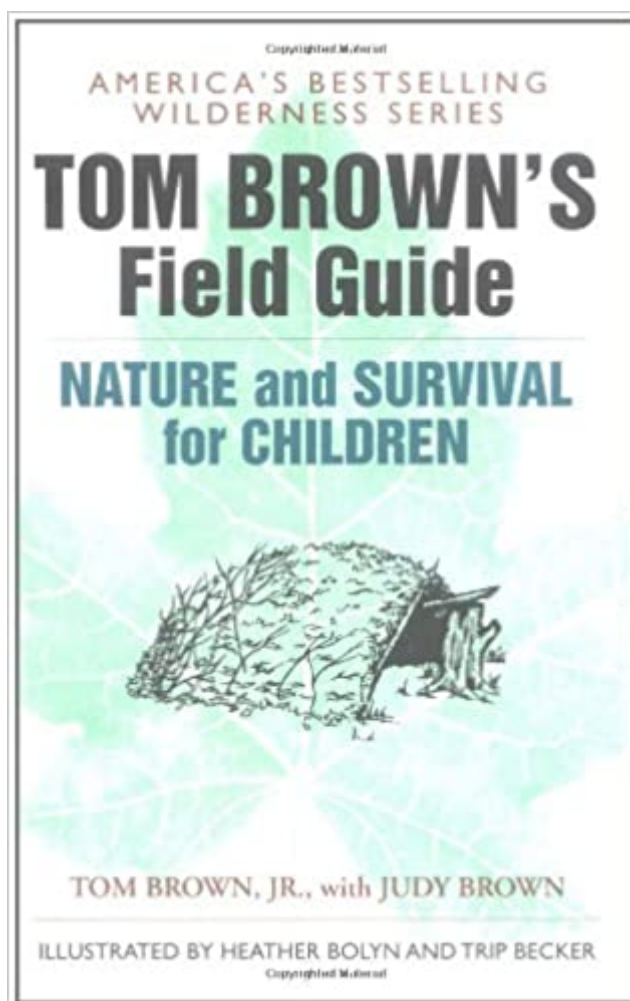

Prolific author, operator of a popular wilderness survival school (in New Jersey's Pine Barrens), "The Tracker" Brown believes that society and school have dulled our sense of the interconnectedness in all nature. His "field guide" stresses awareness, tracking, survival, and a philosophy derived from an Apache elder, and he hopes parents will teach their children these values and skills. The first half of this seventh in a series discusses careful observing in nature; the second, aimed at children aged 4-11, presents survival skills for shelter, water, fire, and food. There are specific suggestions for games to teach these concepts, but the bulk of the text urges teachers (parents) to value the nature ethic. Tom Brown, Jr. began to learn hunting and tracking at the age of eight under the tutelage of an Apache elder, medicine man, and scout in Toms River, New Jersey, and is the author of 16 books on nature. Recently, he was the technical advisor on *The Hunted*, a major motion picture starring Tommy Lee Jones and Benecio Del Toro. Â In 1978, Tom founded the Tracker School in the New Jersey Pine Barrens where he offers more than 25 classes about wilderness survival and environmental protection.

While slightly more useful than Tom Brown's *Guide to Wild Edible and Medicinal Plants*, this book still reads like fiction, rather than a clear cut, true field guide. For the most part, the reader is left wading through BS stories of his adventures and exploits in order to find anything useful. If you want to get a seven or eight year old boy, or tomboy, to read, this would be something that would likely interest them and suck them into reading. If you want to teach them to become lostproof, learn dead reckoning and other navigation methods, or emergency signaling, look elsewhere.

As I was a great proponent of Tom's philosophy, the arrival of my children made me rethink the approach to nature that I needed to teach them. this book is great to guide parents in presenting a new relation to nature to the little ones. You can start early with simple things. My 4 years old is already picking up dogs, cats and squirrels tracks!
