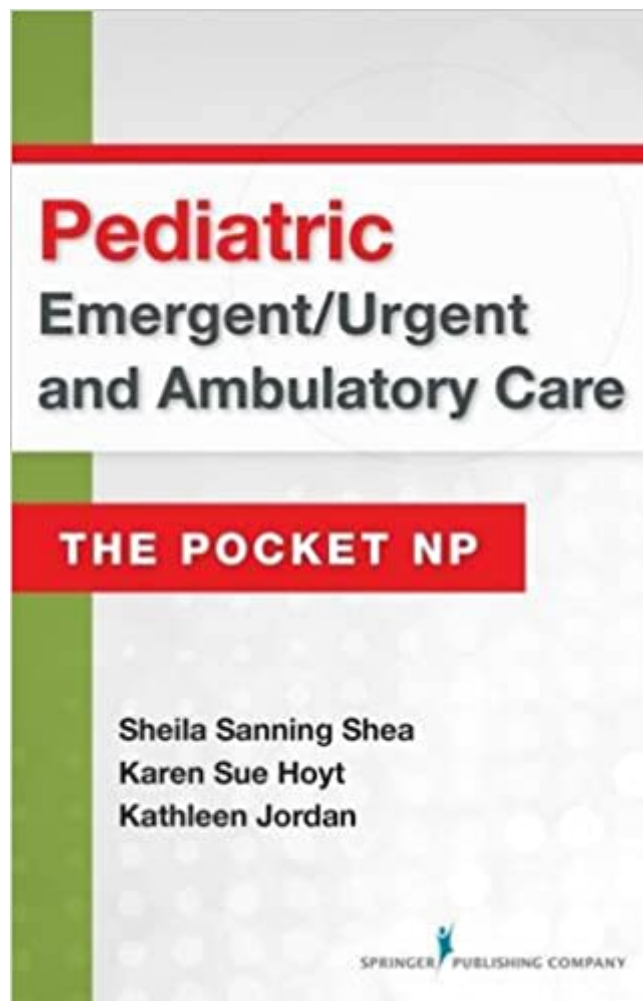




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# Pediatric Emergent/Urgent And Ambulatory Care: The Pocket NP
