

Painting their self portraits, and intertwining their personalities with their individual quirks that make up a strong, multi-layered and

This book-within-a-book was very hard to put down; I read it in two sittings. The writing is so filled with details. It's those details, excruciating, painful, and beautiful, that make it so compelling - like I was right there smelling the smells, and feeling the pain. That, to me, is the mark of really great writing. I enjoyed it more than a lot of things I've read lately. I especially liked Chapter 25. It was short, but the sentiment was so simple and true - I wanted to underline it a thousand times. Jake Parent is a master at the art of writing dialogue. Writing honest, believable, and natural conversations is so tricky, but the author nails it. The characters reminded me that we are all human, and some things are just universal. I also often question male authors' attempts at writing female characters, but I think Jake did an excellent job of portraying Henri, Katie, and Barbara as people,

not just objects. I've read many books where I found myself not caring what happened to the characters, but in this case, I really wanted Nick to succeed and find happiness. This is simply a powerful, inspiring, and dramatic story!

This is a really great book. I'd intended to do a little reading last Saturday and ended up finishing this heartfelt novel in one sitting; I really could not put it down! The characters are beautifully written and the story has true authenticity. I was quickly drawn into the world of Nick, Henri, and Eric, rooting for each of them along the way. (Especially Eric! what a great character. He stuck with me the most.) The unique, quick pace of the writing style was a perfect compliment to the subject matter and pulled me in to every page. This book takes the reader into a world of uncertainty, lies, lack of commitment to family and friends, alcohol, drugs -situations that are foreign to many- and it grabbed me.
