

# Carry On: A Story Of Resilience, Redemption, And An Unlikely Family





## Synopsis

NAACP Image Award Finalist, and Winner of the 2016 Friends of American Writers Literary Award and the Christopher AwardAÂ deeply moving memoir about the unexpected bonds that would transform three lives. Lisa Fenn produced human-interest features for ESPN for over a decade, but one particular story came into her life and never left. After seeing a newspaper image of two young wrestlers from one of Clevelandâ ™s tougher public high schools, Lisa followed a hunch and flew back to her hometown to meet the boys that very day. What she found caused her spirit both to sink and to soar. Leroy Sutton, who lost his legs in a childhood train accident, could often be found riding on the back of Dartanyon Crockett, who was legally blind and had no permanent place to call home. Initially drawn together by their handicaps, the boys soon developed a brother-like bond. When one wrestled, the other sat on the edge of the mat, and their cheerful friendship was a source of inspiration throughout the halls of their high school. As Lisa filmed her feature about this remarkable friendship for ESPN, she grew to understand the suffering Leroy and Dartanyon had endured, and she fought for their trust and their confidence. The three formed a surprising and meaningful connectionâ "and once the television story ended, Lisa realized she couldnâ ™t just walk away. Though Leroyâ ™s and Dartanyonâ ™s futures were limited by abject poverty, Lisa resolved to give them the chance she knew they deserved. She worked tirelessly to see them through school and athletic pursuits, broken hearts, phantom limbs, and the bewildering obstacles that, at every turn, tested their individual strengths even while strengthening the bonds between them. More than a story of two underdogs overcoming innumerable hardships, Carry On is a touching tale of an unlikely family forged through barriers of race, class, and disability. It is a powerful memoir about grit, love, hope, and faithâ "and the courage to carry on, even in the most extraordinary circumstances.

I have to admit up front that I'm in the tank for Lisa and D'artanyon, but a lot of that is because the reason our paths even crossed thanks to their compelling story. As a journalist, Lisa is a total pro, and brings together this unbelievable story of friendship, love, teamwork and overcoming indescribable odds. As the Olympics wind down and we head towards the Paralympic Games, this is the perfect book to get you psyched for the next set of world-class sporting events set for Rio in a few weeks.

Carry On is a fascinating look at the strength, abilities, determination, and hardships of two disabled young men. The author, who met Dartanyon and Leroy while interviewing them for ESPN, soon befriended them and then grew to love them. Lisa's story of the young men's rocky journey from often hopeless childhoods to hopeful adulthoods is inspiring, intriguing, and eye-opening. Her willingness to help and her dogged determination are admirable and her insight about being born into privilege versus being born into poverty is captivating.

It's true; sports stories are never about just the sports. What elevates this book above the standard sports story is that Ms. Fenn respects Dartanyon Crockett and Leroy Sutton as complex, flawed human beings, not just characters in a morality tale. It's this exquisite understanding that probably drove her to get involved in the first place and set in motion the hugely improbable events in this book. I'm inspired by this story to contribute to the trust, buy the book, and cheer for both young men as they maneuver through their extraordinary lives. Their story is astonishing, and Ms. Fenn

brings it to life brilliantly.

Besides that, itâ Â™s a really great story about three incredible people who become a family, with a healthy dose of sporting competitions, failures and triumphs! I know that it will stay with me for a long time, and has already inspired me to seek opportunities to contribute in my own community. I recommend "Carry On" to everyone!
