

Synopsis

I bought this book with some misgivings, I have read every Jack Ryan book written. I did not want to be disappointed with the author change. I must now apologize to Mark Greaney for my doubts. This book was every bit as good as all the rest of the series. I loved the fact that we have many players involved, it is not an easy read. I like a book I have to think about, that does no t go as planned in your mind. There are many things going on at the same time. I love the fact Jack Jr has grown but the best part was the inclusion of Jack Sr, after all he is the character that got us involved in the first place. All good characters must come to an end, but please not yet. Fast paced, believable situations and the hope for yet another book. Good job.

I don't know how Mark Greaney manages to nail Clancy's style and ability, but he has certainly done it in this novel. It starts off kind of slow - made me hope that didn't last - and it didn't. Stick with it because after the first few chapters, it's a page turner for sure. Also like Clancy, Greaney has managed to give us a book that's up with the times exploring cyber espionage. SUPERB book - don't miss it.

Greaney is a fine author, but it seems the ability to connect the reader to the characters isn't quite there. I would recommend this installment to a Clancy fan but go in knowing that Jack Jr will never connect with the average reader as Jack Sr did during his rise up the political ladder.

I read this over a couple of airplane trips. Usually I need to reacquaint myself with characters, but not this time. Not only were the characters completely developed, the story interwove a thousand spiderwebs into the single core at the explosive almost end and the THE surprise ending. Great read and would do it all again.

I've read Clancy from the very beginning and thoroughly enjoyed the Jack Ryan adventures. The style of this story very closely resembles Clancy's, but there isn't the same subtlety of character that I expected and found in Tom Clancy's writing. All that aside, this was a very good read -- just not the same as the original.

I much prefer Mark Greaney to Grant Blackwood as the replacement for the late Tom Clancy. That

said, this Greaney peace isn't quite up to the level of his past works in the series. And the good guys are a little too brilliant in deducing what the bad guys will do.

GreaneyÃfâà ⠬à â,,¢s workaround to that is to put mindless bureaucrats in their way, who conveniently are killed by the threats that the Ãf¢Ã ⠬à Å"CampusÃf¢Ã ⠬à Å• operators tell them about.The ending seemed out of character with Greaney's other Tom Clancy novels, both because it crossed the boundary of plausibility, and also because he made some simple technical errors that aren't common for him. I won't describe the implausible plot elements so not to spoil anyone's read, but I noted the following errors: A-10's are Air Force, not Army; an Apache helicopter wouldn't issue a "Radar lock" warning for a shoulder-fired SAM missile, which would be heat-seeking; and neither F/A-18's or A-10's carry Hellfire missiles. Also, President Jack Ryan's Oval Office speech seemed a little glib, given the recent deaths of dozens of Americans.

Mark Greaney has carried on the tradition of Tom Clancy novels without question. He is a remarkable storyteller and his Tom Clancy book series are as if Mr. Clancy himself has written them. He continues the Clancy series of books with great honor to the late Mr. Clancy.

This Jack Ryan novel by Tom Clancy kept me on the edge of my seat while reading it. The team of which Jack Ryan is a member get involved in situations that keep you interested to a degree you don't want to put the book down, this one was no exception.
