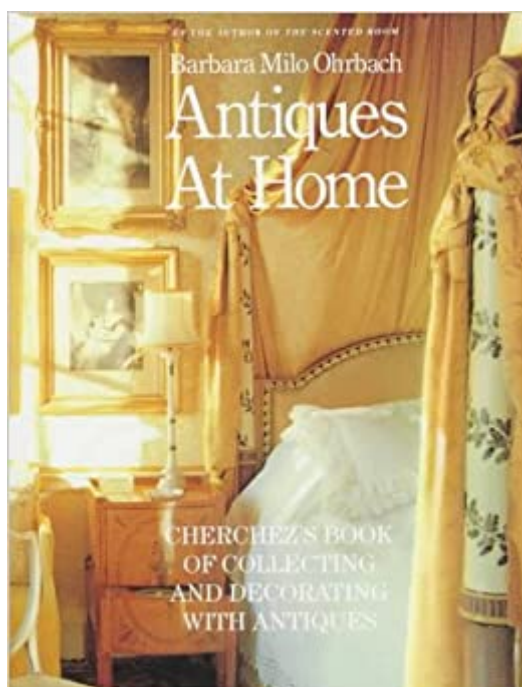


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Antiques At Home: Cherchez's Book Of Collecting And Decorating With Antiques
