

I find that a lot of bio/historical books written by academics fit into one of a few different categories:

(1) to check the box indicating that they know the subject and have written something for an academic audience or to get published; (2) to fit pieces of info into a narrative that the author

already formulated and is now trying to promote; or (3) to just hit the highlights and sell something to an audience that may not necessarily care to know very deeply. This book fits into none of these categories. It reads like a great story begging to be put to screenplay so you could actually see it on film. All of the characters come to life in sympathetic ways. And you walk away picking up so much incidental information about the close of the 19th century, WWI, and WW2, etc., and not only from a British point of view. I have long enjoyed RVW's music. Alldritt does a superb job of explaining the thought process into many of RVW's pieces, their early reception, RVW's frequent penchant for continuing to work on his music even after publication, and his humility to the point of always asking fellow composers for help and insight into his process. RVW was a confident composer and yet suffered from self-doubt for most of his career. I particularly enjoyed the materials dealing with RVW's friendship with Holst; his learning from Ravel; and how different times of his life inspired different pieces of music. I've read other books about RVW's technique; I bought this to learn more about the man. What I found was a book that effortlessly and engagingly revealed both.
