

Who are you? Willie Jess Robertson, president of Duck Commander and Buck Commander. You manufacture duck call and decoys. You are married to Korie and have five children. Rub your imaginary beard and start the adventure. You have just received an order for 10,000 duck calls. It is

also Korie's birthday party tonight and you still need to buy her a present. Wait a minute! What is that outhouse doing in the middle of the warehouse floor? Who is playing a trick on you? John Luke, one of your sons. comes in at that moment. He figures our how to open the door and then disappears inside! What are you going to do? Your first choices are to step inside the outhouse or wait outside to see who is playing a trick on you. Although this book is well written and provides a LOT of different options throughout the book, a few of which were amusing, I was honestly not that impressed. For a book targeted towards 8-12 year olds I thought that many of the situations presented were a little too old for them. Willie often makes comments about making sure he gets the right gift for Korie or he'll never hear the last of it. One option will take you back to 1990 to the night of the Prom where Korie is dancing with John Luke thinking it is Willie. In other options you will head back to 1863 or forward to 2038 and 2319. Some of the endings, in my opinion, were rather pathetic. John Luke's story, The Morning Fog, presented at the end of the book, directs the reader towards God and is well done. I probably should add here that I have never watched Duck Dynasty BUT the kids and I have read many different "option" books which were truly great adventures. This one was not!

I was totally expecting this to be lame, to tell the truth. I've seen all of one, maybe two, episodes of the show. I'm sure if you love the show, you'd be a lot more into this, but honestly, this could have used fictional characters and still be just as fun.I didn't realize when I started that this is a choose-your-own-adventure. I haven't seen one of those books since my childhood! The book started out super basic, and, well, yeah, kinda lame. Exactly what I was expecting. But then, it was choose your own adventure! That quickly turned this into a riot. I imagine I'll eventually end up with the whole series. This is one time the Kindle is actually a great format for the book. No turning to a particular page and possibly seeing something you shouldn't in the meanwhile - you just click the option you want and you're there as fast as a page turn! Silly, strange, bizarre, there's not much here kids won't like. Good fun. 4 stars.
