Gr 5¢⠬â œ8¢⠬â •Featuring an unreliable narrator, this darkly atmospheric and humorless novel, set in a British countryside hospital for children with tuberculosis during World War II, blurs the line between fantasy and reality. Emmaline sees winged horses in the mirrors, meets a fugitive white-winged horse in the garden, and follows the Horse Lord's written instructions to steal a rainbow of brightly colored objects in order to protect the creature from a terrifying, menacing black-feathered horse. Mature and experienced readers might notice that the driven, earnest narrator stops seeing horses whenever she faces the painful realities of her life, but Shepherd deftly keeps the action going to distract from this fact. Chapters are all very short and well formed around single events, giving the book a choppy unevenness that emphasizes how silly Emmaline's quest really is; if it weren't so deeply psychological and gloomy, filled with vividly bleak imagery of bad weather, overworked nuns poorly supervising sick children mid-war in midwinter, and velvet-coated, warm-eyed horses, the story would border on absurdity. I got this book for Christmas. I have really enjoyed a lot of Megan Shepherd $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a}$   $\neg\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a},\phi$ s YA series so I was curious to read her debut middle grade novel. This was a beautifully written book that is full of magical realism and has a bittersweet story. Emmaline has been moved to a hospital for children with tuberculosis during World War II. When one of the horses shows up the garden wounded, Emmaline is given a quest to drive an evil Black Horse away until the wounded horse can heal and flee. The book is overshadowed by World War II; the kids are on their own and many have relatives and parents that have died in the war. Food is short and illness is prevalent throughout; in general things are drab and grey. The book is beautifully written with wonderful descriptions. There are beautiful black and white illustrations interspersed in the story. The ending is somewhat ambiguous leaving the reader to make up their own mind about what happens with Emmaline (Shepherd addresses this issue in the Afterword). I have mixed feelings about the book. I liked how it addressed some of the issues of World War II and I loved the magical horses in the mirrors. I thought overall it was a bit depressing and too much of a tear-jerker (I am not a huge fan of this type of bittersweet story). There is just too much sadness in the idea of these kids having to leave their families and of what everyone goes through as war time progresses. Overall this was a well done story. It $\hat{A}f\hat{A}\phi\hat{A}$  â  $\neg\hat{A}$  â,  $\phi$ s beautifully written and illustrated. It was a bit too sad and melancholy for me, but I did think it was a good magical look at some of the things that happened during WWII. I am giving it to my 9 year old son to read and will try to update this review with his thoughts once he

reads it.

3.5 stars got this book for the horses. They've always had a special place in my heart, and The Secret Horses of Briar Hill looked like a middle grade novel after my own heart. The story was very touching and should be read by many. Emmaline is our narrator. She is both naive yet worldly, a child who had to grow up quickly as she makes a new life in a hospital during World War II. She is surrounded by children who also have "the stillwaters," but she's different from them in one way: she can see winged horses in the mirrors of the hospital. While they serve as a positive note in Emmaline's life, their presence has a meaning even Emmaline couldn't imagine. This is a story of how war shapes people. The location may be a hospital but the children are just as affected by the war as their families. Some of the children have fathers fighting. Some are war orphans. Emmaline herself has been affected by the fighting. The characters each bring a history to the hospital that defines them. This is a middle grade novel, but The Secret Horses of Briar Hill packs powerful meaning for everyone. It is a story of loss and death. Emmaline's life is not easy. She's surrounded by illness. Her dearest friend Anna is very sick. When she meets one of the winged horses in the hospital garden, it brings danger. But this book is also about hope. There are many heartbreaking moments, yet as Emmaline protects Foxfire, the winged horse, from a sinister Black Horse, Emmaline proves she has inner strength to fight for what she believes in. The ending is ambiguous. I don't like this considering the circumstances of Emmaline and the other children. Are the horses real or imagined? Megan Shepherd has an author's note at the end where she states that it's up to the reader to decide what happens. I needed closure, and yet I can't help but think that it's for the best that it is left up to the reader to decide.

Got this for my daughter as a birthday present. She read it within 2 days and she absolutely loved it!!!

Enjoyed reading this book, it was a quick read but will many thought provoking imagery throughout. I really liked that the writer left the decision about what really happened up to the reader, I still think it about it from time and time and wonder.
